



A TWO-MINUTE BRIEF FOR PHYSICIANS

Your name is on the note.

Claims may be rare, and your college may have your back. But **the note becomes yours the moment you sign it**, and the rules for AI-written documentation are still being written. Here is how to stay on the right side of them.

THE COMFORTABLE VERSION

*"The scribe is approved, my college backs me, and claims are rare. **I'm covered.**" Mostly true. And beside the point.*

THREE THINGS THAT ARE TRUE RIGHT NOW

1 The moment you sign, the note is yours.

Not the AI's, not the vendor's. Medical regulators and liability bodies are consistent: **the physician is responsible for the accuracy of the record, whatever tool produced it.** "The AI wrote it" has never been a defence.

2 Approved is not the same as accurate.

A 2026 provincial Auditor General review of approved AI scribes found **most got at least one medication wrong, and nearly half recorded detail that was never discussed.** The only safety net in that model is you, re-reading every line before you sign.

3 The rules are still being written.

AI documentation sits in new legal and regulatory territory in Canada. **The standards are being set right now**, by the Standards Council of Canada and internationally through ISO. What passes today may not be the bar in two years. No one can yet tell you how this lands.

So don't wait to find out. Be protected now.

- ✓ **Every line checked against what was actually said**, before you sign, so wrong doses and invented findings are caught, not carried into the chart.
- ✓ **A sealed, independent, tamper-evident record** of the encounter, so if a note is ever questioned, there is proof of what actually happened.
- ✓ **Built to the emerging Canadian standard**, in step with the Standards Council of Canada and international ISO AI standards, so you are aligned with where the rules are heading, not scrambling to catch up.
